Kansas Vulnerable Needs Planning System

Being prepared for an emergency/disaster is critical in order to help ensure one's safety. There is a new system in place that can help you do just that. It's the Kansas Vulnerable Needs Planning System and it allows individuals with special needs the opportunity to provide information (e.g., contact information, health issues and limitations, etc) to emergency management agencies. This information will help planners in meeting the needs of vulnerable populations.

Individuals considered with having special needs are those who may have additional needs before, during and after an emergency in functional areas including, but not limited to, maintaining independence, communication, transportation, supervision and medical care. Individuals potentially in need of additional assistance during an emergency may include those with disabilities; those who live in institutionalized settings; the elderly and children; those from diverse cultures; those with limited English proficiency or are non-English speaking; and individuals without transportation.

If you or someone you know has special needs and would like to get registered, visit www.hlpmekansas.org. After submission, you will be contacted by a representative of United Way 2-1-1 to verify your information. Registration may also be completed over the phone by calling 2-1-1. The information collected will not be available to the public and will only be released to public safety agencies in order to improve their ability to effectively plan for the needs of vulnerable populations.
