My husband asked me a provoking question, and no it wasn't "What do you want to do for lunch?", although, that is often a provoking question because neither of us ever know the answer!

The question was: Why are you teaching about discipleship?

Good question. My initial, nerdy theological brain said, "Because it is the beginning of the year and that is when the church calendar has us looking into Jesus' baptism and the ways that we follow Jesus throughout his ministry, of course!" Okay, so maybe that's not so obvious.

My head was getting in the way.

So I looked deeper, into my heart, beneath the muddle of what a person "should" know about discipleship, the process, the systems, and dug deeper.

Why am I teaching about discipleship?

Why are we together learning and experiencing discipleship? At the core of discipleship is an understanding, an experience, a theological bias that I carry with me. This core is central to my understanding of God and my relationship with God and the rest of existence. This core is what has drawn me to God in so many seasons of my life over and over again, as if to fall into a new love again and again full of mystery and curiosity.

Why Are We Talking About Discipleship? Cont...

At the core of discipleship is the active, pursuing, invitational, welcoming grace of the living and loving God of creation. This grace fuels us from invitation to transformation, into shaping the world around us through this same grace.

Discipleship, as far as I can understand it in the Wesleyan tradition, is one that holds works of loving God and loving neighbor together, tied up in the motivation and energy of grace.

Discipleship is not only praying, searching the scriptures, or participating in worship; although this is a piece. Discipleship is also extending kindness and mercy, compassion and seeking justice in the world which is fueled by devotion and worship of a God of love.

Kevin M Watson, in his book A Blueprint for Discipleship notes, "Christians...have fallen into the trap of either emphasizing personal piety at the expense of works of mercy or justice, or emphasizing works of mercy or justice at the expense of personal piety."

Discipleship is intended to pair the best of both worlds, the love of God and the love of neighbor, motivated and invited by God's grace.

So when my husband asked: Why are you teaching about discipleship? Once my protestant and very western mind got out of the way, my heart told me:

Because this is the most beautiful process we as human beings can be a part of: To be shaped by grace and to participate in the sacred work of shaping one another in this same grace.

Watson continues, "The ultimate goal [of Christianity] is to be completely renewed in the image of God, to be made perfect in love. Wesley defined this as fulfilling Jesus' double commandment to love God and to love your neighbor as yourself." This can happen through the shaping and process of discipleship.

My heart finds passion and joy when we enter this process together. I recently listened to a beautiful soul of almost 91 years talk of life and the struggles of life; yet, every time I visit with her, she reminds me of how beautiful God is.


Her sweet spirit of thankfulness to God oozes out in every conversation we share together. Her walk with Jesus for 91 years has shaped her into a woman who has worshiped, prayed, searched scripture, cooked for people who are hungry, and advocated for people who have needed it. She had no idea that in that moment, she was shaping me and forming me to be like Jesus too simply because grace had beckoned her so many years ago, and continues to beckon her. It is through this incredible woman that grace beckons me.

Why am I teaching about discipleship? So we can gather moments like this one, with a woman of 91 years expressing the incredible grace of God to a still naïve and searching 30 something. So we can walk alongside one another in God's grace, yes searching scripture and praying and worshiping and being fueled to acts of kindness and mercy and justice. So we can collectively be shaped into the image we are meant to hold and help shape the world into this very sacred image.

May we keep our eyes open for ways that God is inviting us into this process of discipleship through devotion, worship, compassion, and justice, and may we recognize these moments when they come, and grow in our intention to foster and nurture these moments along the way.




NOTE FROM THE YOUTH DIRECTOR




