FROM BUD TO BLOSSOM: LESSONS FROM A RUBBER PLANT

There is a rubber plant in my office. And yes, to those who know me wellit is still alive despite my negligence and lack of watering. This rubber plant has been with me for several years now, and in my first months here at RHUMC, it was a metaphor to me for the deep growth I sensed God inviting us into through the coming season. A season full of hope, anticipation, dreams, and opportunities to step into something God was already up to. 
